



IS YOUR VISION ROADWORTHY?*

You have a legal responsibility to ensure you meet minimum eyesight standards every time you drive. This includes being able to read a car number plate (made after 1 Sept 2001) from 20 metres and have adequate visual fields. You may also have to inform the DVLA if you suffer from certain eye conditions. If you're found to be driving with vision that fails to meet these standards, you face a fine of up to £1,000, points on your licence and potential disqualification. Failing a roadside number plate test means you could have your licence revoked on the spot.

Regular eye tests, every two years unless advised otherwise by your optometrist, will help stop your eyesight becoming a road safety hazard that puts you and other road users at risk.
